We are very excited to introduce the children to Shakespeare and A Midsummer Night's Dream. We will explore the structure of the plot, the relationship between characters and understanding how actors work with scripts and cues. We will also write from the perspective of Puck and rehearse and perform the play. This will help to inform our topic work which includes Elizabethan theatre and The Globe. Later, the children will be writing celebrity gossip columns and love letters about the characters in the play.

To support writing, our grammar and punctuation will focus on revising all areas covered so far and studying some language etymology and morphology along with clause and sentence structures. We will also be revising the Year 5 and 6 word list ahead of the end of Key Stage Assessments
