We will investigate his life and study how he has influenced our language. We will also learn about the time he lived in and how this influenced his work. As part of our topic we will take a closer look at the entertainment in Tudor times as well as researching Queen Elizabeth I. To support our work and to bring him back to life, the children will take part in a Shakespeare theatre workshop, playing the characters and learning some Shakespearean language.


English

Everything is going wrong in Athens. Fathers and daughters are arguing. Even in the supernatural world, the King and Queen of the fairies are at war. On the shortest night of the year, can the fairies put things right - or will they make it worse?

We are very excited to introduce the children to Shakespeare and *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. We will explore the structure of the plot, the relationship between characters and understanding how actors work with scripts and cues. We will also write from the perspective of Puck and rehearse and perform the play. This will help to inform our topic work which includes Elizabethan theatre and The Globe. Later, the children will be writing celebrity gossip columns and love letters about the characters in the play.

To support writing, our grammar and punctuation will focus on revising all areas covered so far and studying some language etymology and morphology along with clause and sentence structures. We will also be revising the Year 5 and 6 word list ahead of the end of Key Stage Assessments.





Science

We will be investigating the fascinating life of Mary Anning and children will explore how living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. We will also learn that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally vary and are not identical to their parents.

Children will use their learning to plan, use, measure, record, report and present findings and data as well as make predictions from their findings, using models to describe scientific ideas.

Upcoming Assessments...

As you know, the children will take the End of Key Stage Assessments the week beginning 13th May. The children will be fully supported through this at school. To help at home, these are our top five tips for what every child needs:

1. Sleep
2. Regular routine
3. Practise – little and often
4. A good breakfast
5. Confidence and reassurance

Revision

On our Information Evening, we handed out some revision guides and a helpful Homework Menu. We suggested revision should be little and often and explained the online resources which are free and available for the children to use at home. Past papers can also be downloaded. In preparation for the upcoming test, the children will take part in extra games and revision activities to secure their spelling of the Curriculum Year 5 and 6 list. Another copy was sent home in a folder before the holidays.
