Year 4 Summer 2 Newsletter

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to what promises to be an exciting and busy summer half term.

Our topic this half term is The Vanishing Rainforests. We will explore the topic through our English, science and geography lessons. The children will discover where the rainforests of the World are, why they are there, who and what inhabits them, their importance to the World and why their existence is threatened. Our topic will launch with a visit to Roundhay Tropical World on Friday 8th June.

In English we will be reading *The Great Kapok Tree* and *The Vanishing Rainforest*, beautiful books, which highlight the threat of deforestation that the rainforests face. The children will also explore poetry, persuasive writing and debate issues around the use of, and threats to, the rainforest. During this half term, we will be revisiting the spellings from previous terms. Please find a list of all the spellings overleaf. We would appreciate your support in helping your child to revisit these.

In maths, linking to our topic, we will start the term by revisiting time and then move to interpreting and presenting discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphical methods, including bar charts and time graphs. We will then explore geometry with properties of angles and quadrilaterals, before finishing the year with symmetry, position and co-ordinates. Our computing sessions will also link to maths through statistics and data handling, with lots of opportunities for the children to collect, present and interpret data electronically in a variety of contexts linked to the rainforest topic.

Learn by heart targets will continue to be sent home, the dates are also listed overleaf. Thank you again for helping your child to achieve fluency of fact recall, and application of their knowledge and understanding through these targets.
