We will be studying the life and work of Charles Dickens and writing and designing our own biographies.  We will then study the characters of Oliver Twist using the film to write diary entries and descriptive narratives. Then we will revise our comprehension skills through analysing Christmas adverts and animations.	It's all about fractions this half term. After comparing, ordering and simplifying, we will learn how to calculate fractions using the four operations.  Then, we will revise finding fractions of amounts before moving on to revising 2D and 3D shapes. Finally, we will use geometry to plot in the four quadrants.		We will be using our scientific skills to investigate whether light travels in straight lines, how shadows are formed, the speed it travels and how it can be reflected. We will work through different investigations, gathering evidence to prove our findings beyond reasonable doubt.

We continue our investigations of the Victorians. We'll be putting them on trial at our assembly. In addition to our work on Dickens and Morris, we'll be looking at some of the achievements of great Victorian women (including the Victorian-born, Emmeline Pankhurst) and asking why they are sometimes missing from the history books. We'll conclude our topic by looking at our great Victorian Christmas traditions.	We will study the life and works of William Morris and Gaudi to make comparisons of their art. We will then consider how their work influenced society more widely. We will use this to make our own designs using different media, including printing.		Children will be using code to design a game. They will design, write and debug a program to solve a problem. or puzzle. Then we will be programming animations for a scene from Oliver Twist.
