English

Cameron is thirteen and in need of a heart transplant when a pioneering doctor approaches his family with a startling proposal...Pig
Heart Boy by the award-winning children's author, Malorie Blackman will form a large part of our English work this half term. We will be
reading on and between the lines to uncover the feelings and motives of the characters. Then we will be writing and performing from the
main character's perspective as well as taking part in the Great Debate, discussing the use of animals in medical science. Finally, we will
be researching, writing and performing a persuasive radio advertisement to promote blood donation. The children will take part in The Voice competition in which they will use all of their persuasive techniques to persuade the judges to turn. Our grammar work will focus
on the use of tense, informal and formal speech and writing, including using the subjunctive (you can ask your child to explain!).


Science

Our science focus this half term will include learning how to describe the changes as humans develop to old age.as well as identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood

We will also investigate how to keep ourselves healthy, recognising the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way our bodies function.

In addition, the children will be able to describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans (plan, use, measure, record, report and present findings and data).

It is a packed half term and any additional reading on this subject would certainly help discussion in class.

These were sent home before the holiday and we will be holding a Learning Log Exhibition afternoon in which children will present their project to their class. Each child will vote for their favourite three and prizes will be awarded. Our previous exhibitions were very impressive and we look forward to seeing the children's creations!
