Attendance and punctuality

As a school we are aware of the difficulties families have faced in the last few years, as a result attendance levels have been affected. We would like to work together to see a significant improvement in attendance in the next school year.

Going to school regularly is essential and it will help your child to develop social skills and confidence, prepare for adult life by getting used to a routine and help them to get better results in their school work.

At Saltaire Primary School, we can support you by making time to meet with you and talk through the problems that may be making it difficult for your child to attend. We can also put you in touch with other services if you need more advice and support. We hope to work together to ensure your child has improved attendance next year.

Above 97%: Less than 6 days absence a year
Excellent attendance! These young people will almost certainly get the best grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Pupils will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.
95%: 10 days absence a year
These pupils are likely to achieve good grades and form a habit of attending school regularly. Pupils who take a 2 week holiday every year can only achieve 95% attendance.
90% and below: 19 days + absence a year
The Government classes Young People in this group as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work. Parents of young people in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by the Local Authority.
