Every child will change their reading book each week. Please make sure your child reads their reading book every day and continue to sign the reading record. We are looking for those star readers (read at least 5 times a week).

Please send your reading books and reading records back to school in your child's bookbag.

Children will read with an adult in school three times a week.

Phonics homework will be set every week and this will be placed in the reading record book. Maths LBH (Learn By Heart) and English/Topic homework will be set half termly. This will be sent out at the beginning of the half term. Please use the purple homework book to record any work your child has done. If you would like your class teacher to see the work that your child has done at any point then please hand the book into the class teacher.
