English Our class text will be <i>Wonder</i> by RJ Palaccio whilst also exploring <i>The Lost Words, Boy at the Back of the Class, The Journey and The Arnival</i> We will work with non-fiction texts from the British Red Cross about the experiences of refugees. Children will collect their stories, poems, songs, art and political speeches in an Anthology of Hope. Humanities Children will use their geographical skills to study the reasons and journeys of human migration. They will collect and analyse statistics and other information in order to draw clear conclusions about locations, ldentify and describe how the physical features affect the human activity within a location. They will also be taught about crisis relief and climate change and how they can make a difference as a global citizen.	Maths We will use our understanding of fractions from last term to master decimals and percentages. Children will be taught to recognise equivalences between decimals, fractions and percentages and find percentages of amounts. We will then move on to teach the concept of algebra, finding pairs if numbers to satisfy two unknowns and use simple formulae. Art/DT Children will complete an Art with Messages project in which they will study the works of Banksy and Swoon and their influences. They will use this as inspiration for their own work in which they will show life-like qualities and abstract proportions to provoke different interpretations. They will use tools to carve and add shapes, texture and pattern.		Science Children will be taught to know who Linnaeus was and learn about his classification system. We will explore classification systems, understanding that they group according to similarities & differences. Children will classify endangered species, whilst studying the reasons for their endangerment. PSHE Our topic has this curriculum area at its heart and will thread through all of our work, including: Recognise and express feelings about their own identities. Relate these to religious beliefs or teachings. Explain their own ideas about the answers to ultimate questions. Explain why their own answers to ultimate questions may differ from those of others.
