#### **Reading Books**

We are continuing to introduce new letter sounds and ask you to keep up the good work practising them at home and applying them when sharing your child's reading book or library books – the children are making fantastic progress!

Library books will be changed on Fridays so please make sure book bags are in school on this day as we cannot send a new book without the old one being returned.

Please remember to make a short comment in your child's reading journal once they have read their book or practised their tricky words. It all counts towards gaining their star reader stickers and lets us know how your child is progressing with reading at home.

# <u>Clothing</u>

Please can you make sure that all items of clothing, coats, hats, scarfs, gloves etc. are clearly named. Lost items can be found and returned so much easier when the name is clearly visible.

#### Wow Moments

These are an opportunity to share your children's achievements at home with your child's class teacher that we might otherwise not hear about. For example, if your child receives a swimming badge, this could be shared with school. Please upload to Evidence Me, the children love looking at themselves and their friends at carpet sessions.

#### Junk Modelling

Please save old boxes e.g. toothpaste, kitchen rolls, chocolate boxes, big boxes, etc and give them to your child's class teacher for small and large junk modelling.

## <u>Class Trays</u>

Please remember to place any important information into the class trays in the morning. This should include letters to the teachers, responses to letters, Tricky Words/ Maths Challenges your child may need changing.

## Where are we from?

In our Topic Sessions we will be learning about where our families are from. We will be looking at the different countries and finding out about the clothes, religions, culture and customs. We will send out a form in Week 3 to find out lots of interesting facts! Thanks in advance.
