A huge welcome to all children and families to Year One. First of all, we would like to say how well the children have settled well into Year One following the summer holidays. We're really proud at how well the children have adapted to their new class and routines. Our priority is looking after your children's wellbeing and making school a safe and positive place to be. In the first few weeks of Year One we will get to know your children really well and find out where they are in their learning and adapt our provision accordingly to meet the needs of each child.

We are so excited about our topic this half term 'Home Sweet Home'. We will be looking at the area in which we live and discussing the difference between city and country homes. We will be reading a selection of books including The Three Little Pigs and The Three Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig. The children will be taking a short walk around Saltaire to find out more about Sir Titus Salt and his village. In maths we will continue to learn to count, read and write numbers to 10 and we shall explore a range of calculations using addition and subtraction.
