English	Maths	Science and Theme
This half term we will be reading 'Viking Boy', an interesting historical fiction book by Tony Bradman, which will enable us to focus on the key skills of characterisation, plot and setting, to enable us to write an alternative story ending. Our GPS work will encompass revision from Year Four, as well as new aspects of the Year Five curriculum.	The children will study place value as well as addition and subtraction this term. There will be plenty of opportunities to consolidate aspects of arithmetic from Year Four, as well as a focus on new learning and plenty of practice of key mathematical skills.	This half term we will be looking at the properties of materials and building on previous learning. Children will carry out experiments to develop their scientific understanding. The theme of Raiders and Traders will look at the Viking invasions, as well as the unification of the country with the Anglo Saxons, and trade between the Vikings and other countries.
