Maths and spelling homework will continue to be sent home every fortnight in the form of a Learn by Heart Target (the first one for this half term will be sent home on **Friday 4**th **March**). We would appreciate any help you could give your child in becoming confident and fluent in their maths and spelling targets. In addition, please could you encourage your child to practise their times tables either verbally or by using TT Rockstars online. The children will be reading in class every day, however, we would appreciate it if you could listen to your child read at home too.

A Learning Log activity will be sent home on **Friday 4th March** for your child to complete over this half term. This half term's learning log should be returned to school by **Monday 4th April.** Children are encouraged to follow their own line of enquiry linked to our Ancient Egyptian Topic.

Curriculum Maths

In English we will be reading Secrets of a Sun King by Emma Carroll. We will write a diary entry from the perspective of Maya, Tutankhamun's best friend in Secrets of the Sun King. We will then start writing our own poems based on The River by Valerie Bloom.

In maths, our half term focus will be fractions and decimals. We will explore equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting, calculating fractions of a quality and problem solving. We will then move onto decimals and look at tenths and hundredths as decimals and also dividing digits by 10 and 100. We will be mastering all of our times tables, up to 12 x 12, in preparation for our times table check.

Our science unit this half term will be exploring sound. We will focus on how sound is made and travels. The children will also explore how we can change the pitch and volume of sound and apply their findings to create their own musical instruments.

Computing

In DT we will be following in the footsteps of the ancient Egyptians by creating Shadufs - a machine for transporting water from lower to higher levels.

In history, we will continue to explore the location in time of the ancient Egyptians, their achievements, daily life, and the rise and fall of the civilisation. We will explore societal roles and compare these to different eras. The children will also look at evidence and draw their own conclusions.

We will learn common commands that will move an onscreen marker to create mathematical patterns using coding and algorithms. We will also put together a simple animation using animation frames and stop motion techniques.
