Assessment

 Part of whole school and class assessments. SENCo may be involved in more specific assessment and observations.

Planning

- Normal curriculum plans include QFT strategies and include individual/group targets.
- Parents and children involved in monitoring and supporting their targets.

Grouping for teaching

- Mainstream class with flexible approach to grouping or some individual work.
- Circle Time activities to help build self-esteem.

Resources

 Main provision by class teacher with advice from SENCO

Curriculum & teaching methods

- Relevant skills practise.
- May need access to basic equipment such as pencil grips, stubby handled paint brush.

Assessment

 As for Range 1, but with advice from health care professionals.

Planning

- Normal curriculum plans include QFT strategies and include individual/group targets.
- Parents and children involved in monitoring and supporting their targets.

Grouping for teaching

- Mainstream class with flexible approach to grouping or some individual work.
- Full inclusion within the National Curriculum Guidance through enhanced use of differentiation and group support.

Resources

- Main provision by class teacher with advice from SENCo/health care professionals.
- Input from additional adult to provide targeted support under the direction of the teacher.

Curriculum & teaching methods

- Handwriting skills programme.
- Access to appropriate assistive technology.
- May need specialist seating and/or furniture/equipment.

Assessment

 For mobility and curriculum access to be carried out by both educational and health colleagues.

Planning

- Curriculum planning now closely linked to targets.
- Modified PE/outdoor curriculum is likely to be needed.

Grouping for teaching

- Mainstream class.
- Small group or 1:1 adult input to practise skills.
- Individual skills based work may need to take place outside the classroom.

Resources

- Flexible use of the classroom support to access the curriculum and develop skills in recording.
- Training and advice from specialist support service for teaching and training staff.

Curriculum and teaching methods

- Programme to support handwriting skills.
- Differentiated writing materials and equipment.
- Differentiated PE curriculum.
- Dressing and undressing skills programme.
- Access to appropriate assistive technology.
- May need specialist seating and/or furniture/equipment.
