We will be sharing the poem From A Railway Carriage by Robert Louis Stevenson to culminate our learning about trains, before creating a haiku poem of our own. Next, we shall be learning all about the famous aviator Amelia Earhart and writing a biography of her life. Finally, we shall be investigating the first moon landing and writing a recount of the events.	We will be consolidating our addition and subtraction skills by learning to calculate using formal methods. We will then move on to focus on money, in particular, recognising coins and notes, learning how to count money and find totals as well as giving change. Lastly, we shall begin to learn more about multiplication by making arrays and making and adding equal groups.	Our new science topic is all about Animals, including Humans. Our learning will be based around: • noticing how animals and humans produce offspring • survival needs • the importance of exercise, a healthy diet and good hygiene
Humanities We will be learning all about the lives of significant individuals from the past who were inspirational in the world of transport, namely the Wright brothers, Amelia Earhart and Amy Johnson.	Art/DT We will be creating a piece of 'wheel' art inspired by the work of Sonia Delauney where we will each learn to blend oil pastilles. Using a range of media, we will then compare Claude Monet's 'Rail Station' with the work of Peter Thorpe. We will be designing and making our own Christmas decoration by cutting, shaping and joining fabric and using basic sewing techniques.
