 We would like to thank parents and carers for supporting their child with their learning at home. It really helps your child if you can reinforce the learning that takes place in class. Children will have regular guided and/or whole class reading sessions at school where they read either independently or with an adult and complete quizzes/answer questions to check their comprehension. We strongly advise that you read with your child at home as often as possible, ideally daily. Your child has a set day on which we change their reading book but please could we request your child's book is in their school book bag each day as we do try to hear children read when we can and some children do find they read books at different speeds, therefore they may need to change it more regularly. Please could you ensure you sign your child's reading record whenever you hear them read. 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Curriculum			
English	Maths	RE	
We will be writing character descriptions of passengers on board the Titanic, writing information texts and retelling the story from a significant person's perspective.	 This term, children will: Revisit the basics specifically focusing on telling the time to the hour and half hour before looking at the two combined. Revisit the idea of mass and capacity initially focusing on non-standard units such as cubes and jugs respectively. They will then look more formally at measuring using standard units. Take part in practical activities which will support their understanding. Children may find wearing a watch useful to support them with our 'telling the time' topic. 	We will be investigating key questions about community and the sense of belonging and encouraging mutual respect and understanding of different faiths and beliefs. We will be learning to understand why Muslims visit the mosque and to explore whether this imparts a sense of belonging. We will also be learning to understand what happens during Hajj and to explore the importance of this very special journey to Muslims.	
Humanities	Art/DT	Computing	
We will be mapping the journey of the Titanic, developing our geographical skills. We will be exploring the historical significance of this tragic event.	We will be tie-dying fabric in order to make bunting and creating dioramas of the Titanic ship using old shoe boxes (any donations would be gratefully received: no lids required!).	We will be designing our own tickets to board the Titanic and vary them by social class. We will try making adaptations using Microsoft, such as by changing the colour, size and style of font as well as uploading an image.
